

The Shire of Mundaring was successful in receiving funds to the value of \$1,830 from the **Perth Biodiversity Project's** Round 5 Targeted Grants program (2006/07) for their project, titled *Wetland Native Grasses of South-West Poster*. The Shire of Mundaring, together with Una Bell (Coordinator—Friends of Throssell Park, Bugle Tree Creek and native grass expert) identified the need to educate a wide ranging audience to recognise native grasses within the South-West of WA.



**Wetland Native Grasses of South-West posters—Project Aims**

The project work involved designing and producing the A2 sized titled Wetland Native Grasses of South-West posters. Aims of the project included:

- Promoting awareness of native grasses in South-West WA
- Education on identification of wetland native grasses
- Improving Local Government Officer skills
- Increased biodiversity of native grasses through increasing recognition skills, thereby promoting good environmental management of native grasses (ensuring native grasses are not mistaken for weeds)
- Increase biodiversity of local natural resources by educating and advocating use of native grasses with local seed provenance for revegetation projects
- Implement recommendations from the Shire of Mundaring's *Community Education Strategy 2003* – which aims to educate, raise awareness and inform community of the Shire's policies, strategies and about Mundaring and its environment.
